

2027 Unit Selection Information Melbourne and Strathfield

1. Selection of Bachelor of Arts Major, Minor and Elective Units

Please refer to the 'Arts Unit Listing' document available under the 'Unit Offerings' tab in your Course Enrolment Guide for detailed information about which units are available in 2027 for each of the Arts Majors and Arts Minors.

If you are a **commencing** student in 2027, you must first select one Arts Major discipline and one Arts Minor discipline from the 2027 Arts Unit Listing and then select units consistent with these disciplines.

If you are a **continuing** student in 2027, you should continue to select units consistent with the Arts Major discipline and with the Arts Minor discipline you have chosen in the previous year. You might also need to select an Arts Elective Unit in 2027. Your Arts Elective Unit can be any unit from the '2027 Arts Unit Listing' document whose pre-requisite requirements you fulfil. Please note that your Arts Elective Unit should not be a psychology unit.

When selecting your major, minor and elective unit, please also keep the following in mind:

Arts Major

A Major is a total of 80cp from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10cp at 100-level, at least 40cp at 200-level and at least 20cp from 300-level. From 2027, the major should include 30 cp at 200-level and 30cp at 300 level. Most majors can also be taken as a minor. Psychology double-degree students cannot undertake a Major in Psychology.

Arts Minor

A Minor is a total of 40cp from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10cp at introductory level (i.e. 100 level) and at least 20cp at advanced level (i.e. 200 or 300 level). Most majors can also be taken as a minor. Psychology double-degree students cannot undertake a Minor in Psychology.

Arts Elective

Individual units undertaken other than those required for the selected majors or minors. These are listed in the Bachelor of Arts Schedule of Unit Offerings (subject to availability, unit limitations and provided that prerequisite requirements are met). There are many Arts and Humanities units running in Rome, in January (*Italian* and *HUMA319 Rome Field School*) and Semester 1 (*Medieval History*, *HIST230 Life and Death in Pompeii*; *HIST350 Women in the Later Roman Empire*, and another Roman history unit). In Semester 2 there is *Global Literature*, *HUMA254 The Idea of the City*, *HUMA319 Rome Field School* and *Baroque and Renaissance Rome*.

2. Selection of Psychology Elective Unit

As part of the course rules, you are required to complete a psychology elective, normally in second semester of 3rd year. Please refer to the table below to find a suitable Psychology Elective Unit for Semester 2 2027 on your campus.
